Cooks will be reimbursed \$0.25 for each tasting ticket collected.

Attendees may purchase a pack of 5 tasting tickets and a set of beads for \$5. This pack provides the attendee 5 chili tastes and one vote (by beads) for the People's Choice Award. Cooks must submit the beads and tickets to the judging tent by 5:00 p.m.

1. You must provide your own tables, chairs, and tent (if you want one).
2. No electricity will be available. You must provide your own cooking source, such as a propane grill.
3. Chili should be prepared in advance and must be kept warm at 165 degrees during the event. Please follow all the requirements of the Health Department Food Handler's Class. At least one member of your booth team must have a food handlers card. Call the Fayetteville CVB immediately if you need to take the food handler's class.
4. The Fayetteville Convention and Visitors Bureau will provide a supply of tasting cups, spoons, and napkins.
5. Set-up will be between 1:30 and 3:00 p.m. Plan to serve chili from 3:00-5:00 p.m. or until you run out. **Prepare at least 6 gallons of chili.**
6. Corn bread entries should be presented to the judging tent by 3:00 p.m.
7. The Fayetteville CVB will provide marked containers for competition. Filled containers should be presented to the judging tent as follows: Non-Traditional Chili at 3:00 p.m. and Traditional Chili at 3:30 p.m.
